2. And we in turn provide for them food, and shelter and love.

B. I read on the ASPCA Website that as of last May, data from a poll of 5,020 respondents confirmed that close to one in five households acquired a CAT or a DOG since the beginning of the pandemic.
3. This would add up to approximately 23 million households based on the recent census.
4. And the vast majority of these households still have that pet in the home- 90 percent for dogs and 85 percent for cats-and are not considering rehoming their pet in the near future.
5. Despite some alarmist headlines tied to regional reports of a surge in owner surrenders, this trend is not currently evident on a national level with many shelters simply seeing a return to pre-pandemic operations and intake.

B. This is because of the love and companionship that our animal friends can bring us - especially in times of trouble.
6. Matt Bershadker, the President and CEO of the ASPCA said, "This incredibly stressful period motivated many people to foster and adopt animals, as well as further cherish the pets already in their lives, and our recent
research shows no significant risk of animals being rehomed by their owners now or in the near future as a result of the lifting of pandemic-related restrictions."
7. He continues, "Pets are still providing their families with joy and comfort, regardless of changes in circumstances, and loving owners continue to recognize and appreciate the essential role pets play in their lives."
8. So our pets are important figures in our lives.
9. We both love and care for one another and provide much needed companionship.
10. And it's that same kind of companionship that we can bring to one another.

## III. Taking God's Love to the World

A. Our first reading today is from the CREATION STORY in Genesis Chapter 1, and tells the story of God creating all the animals - all the birds of the air, and fish in the sea, and everything that creeps upon the ground.

1. But in the Second Chapter of Genesis, we read of another CREATION STORY, where God says, "It is not good for the Man to be alone," and creates all the animals to be humanity's COMPANIONS.
2. Our Animal Friends ARE GIFTS


- Gifts from the God who loves us and wants us to always have LOVE in our lives.

3. And so, in a very real way, our Pets are examples of God's never failing love for us.
4. Our Pets give us love the way it is meant to be shared - free and without qualifications.
B. And that's also the way WE are to share GOD'S LOVE with the people we meet - we are to share it freely and without qualification.
5. A dog can do it - even a cat can do it, when they want to - all our Pets have their own special way to bring us God's love - so we won't be alone.
6. And we too, are called to share that same love with all God's children - freely and without qualification - that they too may know the gift of God' love in their lives.

O God, you have redeemed all creation through the incarnation of your eternal Word;
Protect our pets, your creatures,
who provide us with joy and nonjudgmental companionship;
